# CAMP MECH TECH

Camp Mech Tech is designed to encourage children of low income families, ages 14-16 years old, to explore the automotive field. Participants will learn about braking systems, suspension setups, engine performance, and other automotive service skills. Camp activities include: team building exercises, field trip to dealer service department or automotive manufacturing facility, model car building, speakers, hands-on workshops, and supervised lab time.

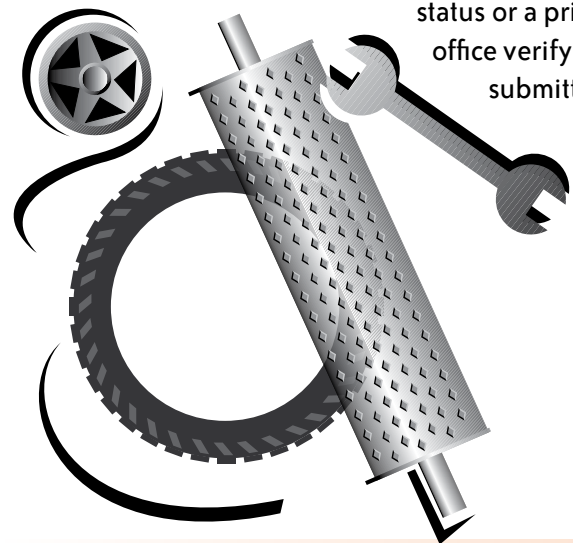

Campers will display their model cars and showcase their knowledge at the closing ceremony at 11am on June 19. Parents and friends are encouraged to attend.

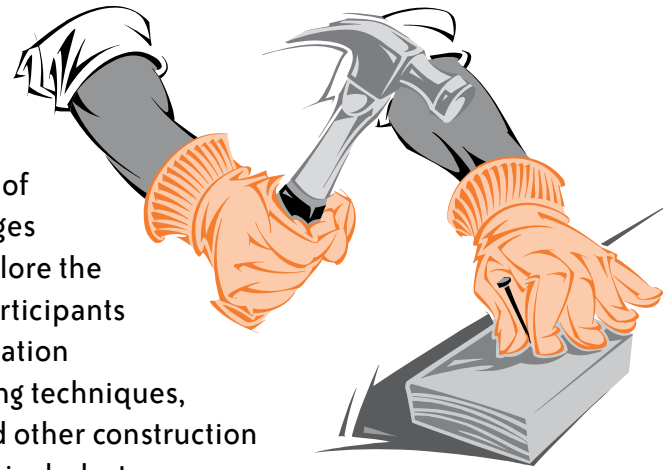
Campers must have their own transportation to and from Tri-County Technical College. A parent or guardian must attend the informational meeting Monday, June 15, from 8am-9am.

# CAMP CONSTRUCTION

Camp Construction is designed to encourage children of low income families, ages 14-16 years old, to explore the construction trade. Participants will learn about foundation preparation, supporting techniques, framing strategies, and other construction skills. Camp activities include: team building exercises, field trip to building site, speakers, hands-on workshops, and supervised lab time.



Camp will be held June 22-26, Monday-Thursday from 8am-4:30pm and Friday from 8am-12pm on the Pendleton campus of Tri-County Technical College. Lunch will be provided Monday-Thursday.

Campers will work together on a group project which will be donated to the college. Campers will also work on individual construction projects that they will take home with them. The projects will be on display the final day of the camp. Parents and friends are encouraged to view the projects at 11am on June 26.

Campers must have their own transportation to and from Tri-County Technical College. A parent or guardian must attend the informational meeting Monday, June 22, from 8am-9am.
