

Supplemental Math Placement Chart

This chart is meant to be a supplemental resource for advising for math placement. It does not take the place of, or supersede the College Placement Chart or College Catalog.

The five pieces of information you must know before you can appropriately place a student are:

- Major
- Transfer plans, including transfer major, institution, etc.
- Required math for the major
- Placement level
- Prior credit (transfer, prior course history, advanced placement, etc.)
