### General Education Requirement

<b>Communication &amp; Literature:</b> Complete 9 credit hours from the list of approved courses satisfying the requirement. You must have one course from SPC 200 or SPC 205.	<b>Electives:</b> Complete at least 17 credit hours of approved elective courses. Courses to be chosen by the student under the guidance of the faculty advisor and in coordination with a major roadmap. Specific courses are excluded from consideration. See First Year notes.
<b>Mathematics or Natural Sciences:</b> Complete at least 7 credits from the list of approved math and science courses. You must have at least 3 credits of math and 4 credits of a natural science course with lab.	<b>Humanities and Social Sciences:</b> Complete 12 credit hours from the list of approved courses satisfying the humanities and social sciences general education requirement. You must have at least 3 credit hours from humanities and 3 credit hours from social science.
<b>Communications and Literature, or Humanities, or Social Science:</b> Complete at least 15 credit hours from approved courses. Courses to be chosen in consultation with the faculty advisor and alignment with the senior institution of choice.	<b>General Education Resources:</b> Approved course listings for each requirement can be found in the Undergraduate Catalog ( <a href="http://tctc.catalog.acalog.com/">http://tctc.catalog.acalog.com/</a> ).

### First Year Notes

Note 1: All first semester courses have specific entry requirements. All Math and Science tracks require a minimum of C or better to advance in the series. Consult the catalog for prerequisites and/or placement scores.

Note 2: Social Science requirements can also be met with ANT 101, ECO 210, ECO 211, GEO 102, PSC 201, PSC 215, PSC 220, PSY 208, PSY 221, and SOC 101.

Note 3: The following courses can be used as electives only: ECO 101; HSS 105; MAT 211, 212, 215; PSY 103, 120. You cannot apply both ECO 101 and ECO 210 or 211 toward degree requirements.

Note 4: The following courses **MAY NOT** be used for the A.A. degree: BIO 100; CHM 100; ENG 100, 155, 156, 165; MAT 101, 102, 155, 170, 171; PHY 101; RDG 100.

Note 5: Select courses that meet specific transfer institution requirements for desired major. Students may earn exemption credit or test into higher foreign language courses. Students that do not need the entire series of courses should work with an advisor to select appropriate replacement credits from elective offerings. Consult the Humanities Department Head for exemption and testing options.
