



Nursing Curriculum Worksheet (2022-2023)

This worksheet outlines the required courses for this major. Students are expected to be familiar with general education and major-specific requirements for their intended major as outlined in the Clemson Undergraduate Catalog. Additionally, students must satisfy any Tri-County prerequisites for the courses below. To complete Bridge program requirements, students must earn 30 credits at Tri-County and a 2.5 GPA during their Bridge year (fall, spring, and optional summer, if needed). Students should consult the backside of this worksheet, the Undergraduate Catalog, and the Bridge Academic Guide for Clemson course equivalencies and alternative courses if students wish to enroll in other courses or if any of the following requirements have been met through dual enrollment or AP/IB credit. Advising worksheets are supplemental planning aids and are for informational purposes only.

Note: Students wanting to apply to change their major to Nursing should continue to take courses in their current major that can lead to a career of choice. There are no guarantees of admission or acceptance to the School of Nursing.

¹ If ENG 101 + 102 is taken for the English Composition requirement, ENG 102 should be taken instead of the A&H Literature requirement.

² Nursing requires PSYC 2010 as the first social science requirement. HIS 201 or PSC 201 are strongly recommended as they satisfy the REACH requirement for graduation. Students with AP, IB, or dual enrollment credit for these courses do not need to repeat them- they may enroll in any Social Science course.

Note: This major is not immediately accessible to Bridge students due to enrollment restrictions. If the School of Nursing grants a change of major after the student matriculates at Clemson, the student will complete NURS 1400 at Clemson. In consultation with the Nursing adviser, an acceptable substitution will be taken to cover NURS 1020 requirement.

FAQs & Change of Major Application Overview

What is a closed academic program?

A closed academic program is an academic program that is not immediately accessible to Bridge students because of enrollment restrictions. Students interested in one of these academic programs must request a change-of-academic program application from the appropriate department after enrolling at Clemson. The opportunity to change to one of these academic programs upon enrollment at Clemson cannot be guaranteed.

What are the sciences required for Nursing?

Currently, the Nursing major requires **CH 1010, BIOL 1030/1050 OR BIOL 1100, MICR 2050 OR 3050, BIOL 2220, and BIOL 2230**. It is highly recommended that students take the sophomore-level science courses at Clemson (BIOL 2220, 2230, and MICR 2050/3050). Please refer to the current Undergraduate Catalog for information concerning the Nursing curriculum.

What criteria are considered as part of the selection process?

The selection committee looks at each student's overall Clemson GPR. In addition, success in science and math courses in the nursing curriculum is stressed. Students who earn grades of "C" or lower in science and math courses may lessen their chances of being chosen. Priority is also given to students who have completed most of the courses not restricted to nursing majors within the first two years of the Nursing curriculum. *BIOL 2220, BIOL 2230, and MICR 2050 should be taken at Clemson.* Please refer to the current Undergraduate Catalog for information concerning the Nursing curriculum.

When is the best time to apply?

Typically, if students have been following the nursing curriculum, the best chance to apply and be accepted to change their academic program is during the spring (January) of the student's sophomore year or second year or once a student has earned 45 or more credits toward the nursing curriculum.

What are my odds of getting into Nursing as a change of academic program student?

Based on the selection criteria, it isn't easy to gauge the competitiveness of each applicant pool. All students who want to change to nursing should know that there are a limited number of spaces each January. The School of Nursing has consistently received more applicants than we have space, making this process highly competitive. We have had anywhere from 45 to 85 qualified applicants for approximately 35-38 spaces. Average Clemson GPR of change of major students accepted by year:

Change of Major Application Overview

1. Applications are available once a year during January. Applications are available on the School of Nursing websites during this time and submitted electronically.
2. Minimally, students must have a 2.75 Clemson GPR and two (2) of the five (5) sciences that are required in the nursing curriculum completed with a grade of a "C" or better to be eligible to apply. Please note that admission is more competitive than the minimum. Students chosen typically have four (4) of the five (5) or all five (5) of the sciences completed and a GPR at or above 3.0, depending on the applicant pool. All science coursework must be completed when students begin the nursing major as a change of major student.
3. Students are eligible to apply for a change of major into Nursing only twice at Clemson University. Previous applications through the admissions process (first-year students or transfer) are not counted in this total.
4. Admission to the School of Nursing is not guaranteed; there is always more change of major applicants than there are clinical spaces.
5. Students who successfully change their major into Nursing should expect to add an extra semester to their intended graduation timeline. Once accepted, the first Fall semester comprises the NURS courses (and NUTR 2050) not taken during the first and second years. The first of the four clinical semesters begin the following Spring semester. Students can "mirror" or "shadow" the first years of the nursing curriculum except for any NURS courses and NUTR 2050 (Note: NUTR 2030 cannot be used for NUTR credit toward the nursing degree).
6. It is highly recommended that all students pursuing a change of academic program to the nursing program follow a parallel plan and the Nursing curriculum that can lead to a career of choice. Note that minors do not necessarily lead to the completion of degree requirements. Students should work with academic advisors in the parallel major plan to determine specific requirements for that degree program.

What can I do to guarantee my acceptance as a change of major into the Nursing program at Clemson?

Nothing, there are no guarantees of admission or acceptance. All students should follow a parallel plan and the Nursing curriculum that can lead to a career of choice if they are not admitted to the Nursing program.

The School of Nursing does not look at: letters of recommendation, work or volunteer experience, number of times applied to the program (if under two times total), or student status (ROTC, Honors, student-athlete, etc.).

Students are encouraged to focus their efforts on factors that are part of the selection process listed in the Undergraduate Catalog to make them competitive with other students accepted.
