



Language and International Health Curriculum Worksheet (2024 – 2025)

CLOSED MAJOR

This worksheet outlines the required courses for this major. Students are expected to be familiar with general education and major-specific requirements for their intended major as outlined in the Clemson Undergraduate Catalog. Additionally, students must satisfy any Tri-County prerequisites for the courses below. To complete Bridge program requirements, students must earn 30 credits at Tri-County and a 2.5 GPA during their Bridge year (fall, spring, and optional summer, if needed). Students should consult the backside of this worksheet, the Undergraduate Catalog, and the Bridge Academic Guide for Clemson course equivalencies and alternative courses if students wish to enroll in other courses or if any of the following requirements have been met through dual enrollment or AP/IB credit. Advising worksheets are supplemental planning aids and are for informational purposes only.

Admission to closed majors is highly competitive and cannot be guaranteed. Students should identify a parallel plan and work toward the degree program they would pursue if admission to the limited enrollment major is denied. Similar majors are Health Science (B.S) and Nursing (B.S.)

⁵ Take up to 6 additional hours of courses listed in the Bridge Student Academic and Advising Guide that will transfer to Clemson.

	<i>Students who wish to take Chinese or French instead of Spanish may do so at Clemson beginning their sophomore year. Take another Social Science course from a different discipline, an Arts & Humanities (Non-Lit.) course, and a major requirement instead of the modern language courses at Tri-County.</i>	

Note: This major is not immediately accessible to Bridge students due to enrollment limitations. If a change of major through application submission in the fall is granted by the Language and International Health department after the student matriculates at Clemson, students will complete HLTH 2020, HLTH 2980, LIH 1270, at Clemson.
