



Art (BA) Curriculum Worksheet (2024 – 2025)

This worksheet outlines the required courses for this major. Students are expected to be familiar with general education and major-specific requirements for their intended major as outlined in the Clemson Undergraduate Catalog. Additionally, students must satisfy any Tri-County prerequisites for the courses below. To complete Bridge program requirements, students must earn 30 credits at Tri-County and a 2.5 GPA during their Bridge year (fall, spring, and optional summer, if needed). Students should consult the backside of this worksheet, the Undergraduate Catalog, and the Bridge Academic Guide for Clemson course equivalencies and alternative courses if students wish to enroll in other courses or if any of the following requirements have been met through dual enrollment or AP/IB credit. Advising worksheets are supplemental planning aids and are for informational purposes only.

Note: Admitted BA Art students should attempt to meet Bridge requirements by the end of the Spring semester **and** include studio-based courses in their Bridge year, if available. Review the Clemson TCEL and speak with your advisor or the Art Office at Clemson for more information. Prior to Fall, BA Art Bridge students are recommended to consider an additional 1-2 studio foundations / other studio art courses in Summer (whether via Clemson or another institution), especially if they need undertake Modern Language requirements on Main Campus. Please confirm any AP credits or dual-enrollment credits that may fulfill BFA requirements with your advisor.

Changing your major to BA Art: Students who want to switch to the BA Art degree program after starting their Bridge year should contact Mandy Ferguson or Profs. McDonald & Zimany. To be considered, students must: (1) meet Bridge requirements (30 transferrable credits & 2.5 GPA) as listed on the front by the end of the Spring semester, and (2) consider a summer studio Foundations or similar studio course at Clemson or other approved institution prior to joining Main Campus.
