



Humanities (AAH) Undeclared Curriculum Worksheet (2024 – 2025)

This worksheet outlines the required courses for this major. Students are expected to be familiar with general education and major-specific requirements for their intended major as outlined in the Clemson Undergraduate Catalog. Additionally, students must satisfy any Tri-County prerequisites for the courses below. To complete Bridge program requirements, students must earn 30 credits at Tri-County and a 2.5 GPA during their Bridge year (fall, spring, and optional summer, if needed). Students should consult the backside of this worksheet, the Undergraduate Catalog, and the Bridge Academic Guide for Clemson course equivalencies and alternative courses if students wish to enroll in other classes or if any of the following requirements have been met through dual enrollment or AP/IB credit. Advising worksheets are supplemental planning aids and are for informational purposes only.

Undecided students are encouraged to take classes in a major of interest to learn more about the subject. Visit the Michelin Career Center on the third floor of Hendrix Student Center to take an Interest Inventory to help explore different career paths. Students pursuing a closed major should identify a parallel plan they would pursue if admission to the limited enrollment major is denied.

Undecided students MUST change their major by the end of their Bridge year and select a degree-granting program before crossing the bridge to Clemson.
