APPLICATION CRITERIA
1. Participate in the Online Pre-Nursing Workshop and submit verification (located on the Nursing webpage listed above).
2. TEAS score minimums: Achieve the minimum TEAS Adjusted Individual Test Score (AITS) of 50%. The TEAS test can be taken twice in an Academic Calendar year which begins August 1 st and ends July 31 st .
3. Achieve a level 2 or higher on the Assessment Technology Institute (ATI) RN Fundamentals Exam. The ATI RN Fundamentals Exam can be taken twice in an Academic Calendar year which begins August 1 st and ends July 31 st .
4. Overall GPA at least 2.5
5. Have taken BIO 101, BIO 210, ENG 101, MAT 120, and BIO 211 (or be registered for it) with a grade of "C" or higher.
6. BIO 101, BIO 210, BIO 211, and BIO 225 courses may be attempted only two times to achieve a passing grade of "C" or higher. An attempt is defined as completing the course and receiving a grade or a withdrawal from the course after the drop date. This criteria is in effect for students completing these courses in Spring 2021 or after.
7. BIO 101, BIO 210, BIO 211, and BIO 225 courses once completed, expire in 5 years. This criteria is in effect for students enrolled at (current catalog term) TCTC in Spring 2021 or after. For those applicants whose BIO 210, BIO 211, or both are greater than 5 years old, the ATI Anatomy and Physiology test is required with a minimum score of 61% or higher. If the minimum score is not achieved, students are required to repeat BIO 210 and BIO 211. There are no test-out options for BIO 101 and BIO 225. The Anatomy and Physiology test can be taken twice in an Academic Calendar year which begins August 1st and ends July 31st.
8. LPN license must be a current and unencumbered Multi state license or Paramedic Certification must be current and unencumbered.
9. LPN Nursing Education must be from a nationally (ACEN) credentialed college/program or Paramedics require an Associate in Applied Science Degree.

***If you answered "No" to questions 1-9, you do not meet the application criteria. YOU MAY NOT SUBMIT THE APPLICATION AT THIS TIME.**
